In consideration of establishing a maximum funding threshold to ensure that these funds are distributed as widely as possible, while being mindful of each student's socioeconomic circumstances in the staging and administration of these grants, each CARES Grant Award will in an amount equal to 50% of the Payment Period Pell Grant Award. Any remaining allocations will be divided amongst other FSA eligible recipients, provided that they are meeting FSA eligibility requirements until all of the Minimum Allocation to be Awarded for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students has been exhausted.
